WestCONnex Health Impacts

The Problem

- Euston road McEvoy street as a traffic sewer
- Today 6,000 cars, tomorrow 63,000 cars (Parramatta road 62,000 Haberfield) (current)
- Welcome pollution, noise, loss of amenity and bad health impacts



Near Roadway Air Pollution and Health: USA EPA

- People who live, work or attend school near major roads appear to have an increased incidence and severity of health problems associated with air pollution exposures related to roadway traffic.
- These risks include:
 - Higher rates of asthma onset and aggravation
 - Cardiovascular disease
 - Impaired lung development in children
 - Pre-term and low-birthweight infants
 - Childhood leukaemia
 - Premature death





Vehicle emissions – a harmful cocktail of particulate matter, carbon dioxide, sulphur dioxide, nitrogen oxide, ozone etc

National Environment Protection Council "... many pollutants are **without** a safe threshold" (2008 report)



How bad could it be?

- Approx 3000 Australians per year die from air pollution & vehicle emission-related causes
- It's higher than the road toll

Urban heat island effects

Heat islands: traffic is a major contributor

- Increase vegetation near roads


